For IN-PERSON ASSESSMENTS, documentation must demonstrate illness/ misadventure <u>on the</u> <u>assessment due date</u>.

For SUBMITTED WRITTEN ASSESSMENTS, documentation must demonstrate illness/ misadventure <u>no</u> <u>more than 1 week prior to the assessment due date</u>.

Students must note:

- A **Professional Practitioners Certificate (PPC)** is supplied with the Special Consideration Form and is to be filled in by a registered medical practitioner or counsellor (from either a private or the on-campus medical/ counselling services). The Faculty may check the authenticity of details provided on a PPC. **Post-dated Professional Practitioners Certificates may be acceptable.**
- If you were affected by illness or accident and did not attend a professional practitioner, you may submit a statutory declaration, but the evidence will be of lower value as it is your own personal opinion, not that of an independent professional. Only well-attested serious illness or misadventure during a semester or occurring at the time of an examination will warrant Special Consideration for academic performance.
- A **Statutory Declaration** must be signed by the applicant. The signature must be witnessed by a Justice of the Peace. The declaration is equivalent to swearing an oath in court. Serious penalties apply for misleading or untruthful statutory declarations. The Faculty may check the authenticity of details provided on a statutory declaration form.
- Documents submitted to support a special consideration claim must be in English or accompanied by a certified English translation.
